- Knowledge of orchestral and choral repertoire.
- At least 2 years' experience in a comparable position.
- Strong computer skills and proficiency in Microsoft Office (Word, Excel)
- Strong project management skills and ability to juggle multiple tasks at different stages simultaneously.
- Some standing, walking, bending, frequent use of hands, stooping and lifting (at least 30 pounds) is needed
